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Financial explanation

In 2025, Artemis successfully completed its transition to financial independence. Following our 2024 establishment as an official foundation, this year marked the opening of Artemis' own dedicated bank account, allowing for direct management of our resources and greater fiscal agility. While the budget of the space department remained €5.000, there was the transfer of residual funds from the previous year. Most of the budget was spent on Space Bars and the end-of-year BBQ, a key activity of our society to bring students and staff together in an informal environment. Additionally, we used part of the funds to purchase board polos, ensuring that board members are easily recognizable during events. This helps them serve as a first point of contact between students, professors, and companies. Organizational costs, such as the bank account and KvK, were also necessary to maintain Artemis' operations. We also received student contributions, which were specifically used to organize the end-of-year BBQ. To meet the requirements for ANBI status, we have minimized net income, ensuring that Artemis does not generate a profit. Furthermore, over 90% of our expenditures directly or indirectly serve the public interest.
